



Director's Report March 12, 2025

Student Enrollment: 203

Program Referrals: All programs have active referrals.

Staffing: We currently have ASL interpreter positions that we are looking to fill in the CAPS DHHP middle and high school programs in Newton. We have a long-term substitute teaching position open in the Kelly Day School and a long-term substitute teaching position at the Gateway School.

Space: We are finalizing floor plans for the potential new space for our Senators Program and potential Community Based Adult Day program. We are expecting a draft lease soon and will look to share this out at the April meeting.

Contracted Services Availability: CAPS AAC/AT department is available for evaluation and consultation. CAPS School psychologist is available to complete assessments. Please reach out with any speech, TVI, and O&M needs.

Budget FY2026: The FY2026 draft budget summary will be presented to the finance subcommittee before the March 12th board meeting.

Collaborative Agreement: The draft collaborative agreement was shared with DESE after the February board meeting. The draft included adding the Wachusett Regional School District as a member. Adult day programming services were also added to the agreement. Minor revisions based on DESE recommendations have been made. We can move forward with a second vote and next steps with district school committee approvals.

Highlights and Initiatives:

- Monty Tech/CAPS STEP Spring Program is up and running for the second year.
- CAPS Central Mass ETL Forum met on February 28th. Feedback from the training was overwhelmingly positive. Two additional professional development training dates will be offered to district ETLs this spring.
- Grant Update: Professional development, coaching, and modification of Gateway space is continuing as a result of the receipt of the Reducing or Eliminating the use of Time out Space Grant. We plan to reapply if this grant is renewed. CAPS has been awarded grant funds for the implementation of the new IEP.

•	MOEC is celebrating 50 years of Special Education and has launched a PR campaign highlighting
	collaboratives this year. CAPS Deaf/Hard of Hearing Program will be featured soon.

•	The new Gateway Elementary classroom space renovation has been completed, allowing for additional
	student enrollments at the Kindergarten and first grade levels.
